Currently, Hamas has been shelling Southern Israeli towns with hundreds of Qassam missiles from their strongholds in Gaza and many believe further attack plans are being hatched by Hezbollah or Hamas. During the summer of 2006, 43 civilians were killed and 4,262 were wounded in less than 30 days when thousands of missiles rained down on populated Israeli areas.

Millions of people all around the world watched as helpless Israeli citizens sought safety from these unprovoked attacks.

Under constant threat of missile attacks from terrorist groups based out of Lebanon and Syria in the north and Gaza in the south, there has been a great need for a safe place to take shelter during these air raids. Air raid sirens give men, women and children approximately 30 to 90 seconds time to find a safe place to seek refuge.

The answer to that need is "Operation Lifeshield" shelters. "Operation Lifeshield's" goal is to place shelters next to kindergartens, classrooms, youth clubs, golden age centers, synagogues and temporary structures that offer no protection from rocket attacks.

This emergency campaign, "Operation Lifeshield," was created to facilitate the donations of these desperately needed air raid shelters throughout Israel's public open-air areas.

This life saving project was initiated by Israeli/Americans Shep Alster and Josh Adler in order to provide the citizens of Israel some sort of safety from incoming missiles.

Despite Israel's best efforts, it is never known when an attack may come and from which direction it is coming. However, it is possible to reach shelter as long as there is shelter to be found. "Operation Lifeshield" shelters cannot provide these communities with peace, only peace of mind.

Time is short and your financial support is needed to construct a life saving shelter. The cost of each "Lifeshield" shelter is approximately \$36,000, a small price to pay in the effort to save lives. "Operation Lifeshield" is seeking generous partners in its endeavor to help save the lives of the Israeli people.

- ◆ Each shelter weighs 45 tons and can be transported to the locality by trucks and set in place using a crane.
- ◆ The shelters have been approved by and carry the seal of the Israeli Defense Force Homefront Command.
- ◆ The shelters are not subject to the underground and in-ground permit process because they have been approved as above-ground shelters by IDF Homefront Command.
- ◆ Walls and ceilings of each shelter are constructed out of 12" of steel reinforced solid concrete.
- ◆ Interior walls and ceilings are lined with steel sheeting to provide additional protection against penetration.
- ◆ Shelters are constructed under strict on-site supervision.
- ◆ The shelters come standard with special armored steel door and window sets, exterior and interior lighting, electrical outlets, phone and cable outlets, and a generator hookup preparation.
- ◆ Each shelter is then inspected, certified, and strategically placed.
- ◆ Shelters can also be transported should security needs have to be met in another location.
